



Job Title: Preventive Maintenance Service Technician

Reports to: Service Manager

Job Summary

JOB DESCRIPTION

This position consists of performing minor repairs and maintenance on a wide range of construction equipment in the field. The PM Service Technicians primary objective is to minimize customer downtime on equipment through quick, accurate services. When not performing services in the field, regular preventive maintenance and minor repairs on equipment and delivery vehicles are performed in the branch shop. The position requires advanced troubleshooting skills with electrical, hydraulic, ignition, pneumatic systems, diesel and gas engines as well as drive trains.

Essential Job Duties and Responsibilities

- Work every day to create a safer environment for customers and coworkers by making safety a number one priority. Attends safety training when requested and speaks up when there is an opportunity to improve safety conditions.
- Perform preventive maintenance and repairs on various types of heavy construction equipment in the field and shop
- Ensure total customer satisfaction prior to leaving the jobsite
- Able to work a rotating on-call weekend schedule
- Maintain a clean and organized service bay/truck

Qualifications

Education, Skills & Requirements

- Must possess a high level of equipment repair knowledge
- Must be able to provide, understand and complete written reports of work performed on equipment
- Higher level education is preferred but not required (trade school, degree, certificate)
- Must have extensive knowledge in electrical, hydraulic and pneumatic systems
- Must have knowledge in gas and diesel engines and drivetrains
- Driver's License and clean driving record – CDL preferred but not required
- Must have an appropriate tool set for the position
- Welding and Fabrication skills are a plus

Working conditions

- Pushing: Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward or outward.
- Pulling: Using upper extremities to exert force in order to draw, drag, haul or tug objects in a sustained motion.
- Lifting: Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position-to-position. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires the substantial use of the upper extremities and back muscles.
- Medium work: Exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 20 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.
- Heavy work: Exerting up to 100 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects.
- The worker is subject to both environmental conditions: Activities occur inside and outside.
- The worker is subject to noise: There is sufficient noise to cause the worker to shout in order to be heard above the ambient noise level.

- The worker is subject to hazards: Includes a variety of physical conditions such as proximity to moving mechanical parts, electrical current, working on scaffolding and high places, exposure to high heat or exposure to chemicals.
